Key Themes

Food supply is a critical issue heightened by the region's current economic difficulties. The food sector plays an important part in the performance of all economies; yet it is subject to the greatest distortions and trade barriers. Businesses, communities, and governments all stand to gain from working together towards improvements in the regional food system that result in a safer, more secure food supply.

The Pacific Basin Economic Council (PBEC) and APEC Business Advisory Council (ABAC) believe it is imperative for the health and welfare of millions of people that APEC members work to improve the rules and practices that distort the production of and trade in food. By focusing on capacity building measures to accompany the promotion and liberalization of food trade, APEC can assure that all sectors of society reap the social and economic benefits of a more open, efficient food system.

The development of a regional food system must be integrated into APEC's work program to achieve free and open trade and investment across all sectors. In support of APEC efforts, the regional agricultural private sector must develop a complementary and aligned work program that focuses on the areas of food trade, technology transfer, and rural infrastructure development. As an initial step in developing that work program, PBEC and ABAC will host this regional conference to develop agricultural strategies to support APEC efforts.
